NAAS, an incorporated, market, assize and union town and parish, containing 13 townlands and the town of Tallins, 13 townlands and the town of Tanins, which see (formerly a parliamentary borough), is in the barony of North Naas, co. Kildare, head of a petty sessional division and dispensary district, diocese of Kildare, with a station on the Great Southern and Western railway, 18 miles south-west from Dublin, at the junction of the Cork and Limerick main roads and about 1½ from the river Liffey. A branch of the Grand canal, which comes up to the town, opens a ready communication with Dublin city. This place was anciently the residence of the kings of Leinster, and the name signifies the "Place of Elders." for here the states of that province assembled during the 6th, 7th and 8th centuries, and the ruins of various religious edifices still exist, as evidence of the importance once enjoyed by Naas. In 1477 the Earl of Kildare, acting as lord-deputy, held a parliament here. The town consists principally of one good street, and the business is mainly of a general retail character. There are three hotels, the "Royal," at the are three hotels, the "Roya!," at the southern extremity of the town, the "Commercial" and the "Railway" at the northern. The borough is of great antiquity, having charters of Henry V. Elizabeth and James I. and it sent two members to the Irish Parliament until the Legislative Union. The municipal affairs are now regulated by town commissioners and the magistrates, who sit in petty sessions every Monday. Quarter sessions are held for the district in January, April, June and October, and the general assizes are held in March and July. The public buildings are, the Town hall (with market in the rear) and Court house, both handsome modern stone buildings, facing the main street, a gaol, at the south-western a constabulary barrack, and a fine military barrack, on the Limerick road, this town being the head-quarters of the Military district, No. 102 (Royal Dublin Fusiliers). Naas gives the title of baron to the family of Bourke, long connected with the town. The Right Hon. John Bourke, sometime M.P. for Naas, was created Baron of Naas 1776. and in 1785 advanced to the dignity of and in 1785 advanced to the dignity of Earl of Mayo. There is one dispensary and a union workhouse. There are two newspapers printed and published in the town, the "Leinster Leader" (Nationalist) and the "Kildare Observer" (Conservative). The spacious rains

of Jigginstown, formerly called Sigginstown, may be seen on the Limerick road, less than a mile from Naas: this princely mansion was commenced by the celebrated Earl of Strafford Lord Lieutenant of Ireland in the reign of Charles I. : it was. however never completed, but left almost in its present unfinished state, when he was summoned before the English Parliament, and afterwards beheaded: the groined and vaulted cellars are singularly and beautifully constructed. The places of worship are the Protestant church, a stone building with a stained window in the chancel. The Catholic church is a very handsome structure, surmounted by a lofty spire. The Presbyterian church (opened in 1865) is a structure of smaller dimensions, the Gothic style. A convent of the Sisters of Mercy, established here, is a valuable foundation for the instruction of poor children and administering consolation and relief to the indigent sick. In the cemetery of the Protestant church stands St. David's Castle, now the residence of the vicar, and near to it is the diocesan school, instituted in the reign of Elizabeth, but at present closed. The other public schools are the parochial and National, both of which appear to be efficiently conducted. The Christian Brothers also conduct a The Christian Brothers also conduct a very large school, in which are educated the majority of the Catholic children of the parish. The markets are held on Monday and Thursday; and the fars on the 3rd Wednesday monthly. The area of the parish comprises 5,526 acres; the population in 1891 was 4,030, of which 211 were in Sallins: the area of the town comprises 4,541 acres; the

many of the buildings are ornamental, especially the sessions house, with its Ionic portico. Ward's is an excellent family and commercial hotel. The Frotestant church is a handsome building, with a pinnacled tower. The Catholic church is also an ornament to the town; and there is one for Wesleyans. There are three National schools here, one of which is conducted by the nuns of the Presentation Convent, and there are also a ChristianBrothers' school and a school for infants; a well-supported fever hospital and a dispensary. The contiguous mansion of Dunleckny, which has been modernized, was the ancient seat of the Bagnals or Bagenals. who settled in this county about the middle of the 16th century. Fairs are held on the first Monday after first Wednesday in each month. The area of the township comprises 427 acres; the population in 1891 was 1,920.
